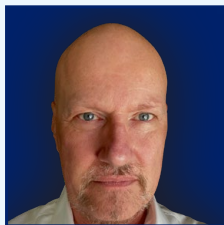

He was appointed Minister for Just Transition, Employment and Fair Work in May 2021.

Richard was born in Paisley in 1969 and was educated at Williamwood High School, Clarkston, Glasgow. He graduated with BA Honours in Political Studies from Stirling University.

Richard's first employment was with the South of Scotland Electricity Board and prior to his election to Holyrood worked for Dundee City Council.

Richard is married with two sons and lives near Elgin.

Paul Wheelhouse is Net Zero Lead on Energy Transition at South of Scotland Enterprise (SOSE) and is chairing SOSE's Energy Transition Group as it develops an Energy Transition Plan for the area covering Dumfries and Galloway and Scottish Borders.

Paul, who was an economist for 18 years prior to representing South Scotland for 10 years in the Scottish Parliament, served as Scotland's Energy Minister over the period from 2016 until 2021, and Minister for Environment and Climate Change between 2012 and 2014. In his time as Energy Minister, Paul oversaw development of Scotland's first Energy Strategy in 2017, first Onshore Wind Policy Statement, Hydrogen Policy Statement, Heat Networks (Scotland) Act and draft Heat in Buildings Strategy.

Paul was ministerial co-chair of the Scottish Government's energy-related Strategic Leadership Groups, including those on Renewable Energy and on Energy Networks, and the Scottish Offshore Wind Energy Council.

SETTING THE STANDARD FOR NET ZERO IN PUBLIC SECTOR BUILDINGS

Ross is an energy professional and chartered engineer with over 16 years' experience of design and technical advisory for the built environment and industry.

Ross is part of the Net Zero team at SFT and focuses on carbon reduction in the public sector estate. The Scottish Government launched their Net Zero Public Sector Buildings Standard in 2021.

This voluntary Standard supports public bodies to meet their net zero commitments for their new build and major refurbishment building projects. Ross will provide an overview of the aspirations for the Standard, how it is applied in practice and how it can support public sector organisations to take the right steps in their current new build and major refurbishment projects.

Under her leadership, Glasgow has been named the host of COP26, a Global Green City, and the European Capital of Sport for 2023. She is currently co-chair of UK100, a network of local leaders committed to delivering Net Zero, and an advisory board member of the Cities Climate Investment Commission, which is addressing the challenge of financing Net Zero transition in major cities across the UK.

Susan has worked in a variety of policy and research roles in the Scottish Parliament and the third sector, and as a freelance writer and editor specialising in health and social care policy. She is a graduate of both Glasgow and Strathclyde Universities.

DECARBONISATION PATHWAYS FOR GLASGOW'S POLLOK PARK

Fergus joined IES in June 2019, after completing his MSc in Sustainable Engineering. In his MSc he worked on two group projects finding realistic solutions for the optimisation and decarbonisation of the local microgrid energy systems on the isles of Gigha and Eigg. His Masters' thesis was on Policy barriers to clean energy deployment in cities. He also has a BSc in Physics.

Since joining IES he has worked on a variety of projects, the main two being REWIRE Warrington and Pollok Park. The former has involved finding innovative solutions to create a digital twin of over 100,000 buildings at the borough council level – including the generation of energy profiles for each building and the simulation of future scenarios for interventions such as retrofit, district heating, community scale renewables etc. The Pollok Park project involved the creation of a digital twin for three buildings, before testing different scenarios to find the optimal solutions for complete decarbonisation of the park's electrical and heat networks.

HOW CAN THE PUBLIC SECTOR LEAD SCOTLAND'S NET ZERO JOURNEY?

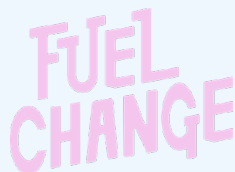
With Scotland's ambitious 2045 Net Zero Targets, the challenge remains for the public sector in identifying how to gather the necessary carbon data in order to accurately measure Scotland's carbon reduction journey.

Gavin Tweedie is the co-founder and chairman of the social enterprise Net Zero Nation Ltd and Scottish Net Zero community which he helped establish in January 2021 with the Scottish Business Network and James Napier at CBN Expert. The organisation has grown to over 1000 members and mobilised over 1bn in annual revenues to sign up to the UN Race to Zero. They have created a Net Zero Accelerator programme to mobilise action and helped the members to form new partnerships and relationships, influencing a change in the mindset around Net Zero and Sustainable decision making.

He helps and supports entrepreneurs and organisations who prioritise people, planet, profit with a portfolio of work converging around Net Zero, Sustainability and Circular Economy. He works with the Fuel Change organisation helping support apprentices and companies transform their ideas for low carbon solutions into new products and solutions, creating green jobs and companies in Scotland.

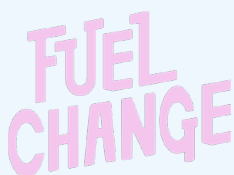
